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






Figure 1: James Hicks

4. Rice Hicks was born on Sunday, March 01, 1829, in Jessamine Co., Kentucky. He was the son of William Hicks Jr. (8) and Rebecca Alcorn (9).



Rice died in Carroll Co. on April 19, 1915, at the age of 86. He was buried at Port Royal Cemetery (unmarked) in Port Royal, Henry Co..

Rice Hicks

Rice Hicks, son of William and Rebecca (Alcorn) Hicks appears in the 1850 census in Gallatin County, Kentucky, as age 16, a son of William Hicks, 60, and his wife Rebecca. Rebecca is the Rebecca Alcorn shown in the marriage bond dated 10 January 1815, Fayette County, Kentucky. Rice Hicks married Harriett Ann Swango (also a descendant of Abraham Swango - click here to see how) on 6 April 1859 in Gallatin County, Kentucky, per their marriage license and marriage certificate.

The death certificate of Rice Hicks, dated 19 April 1915, shows his death in Jessamine County, Kentucky. His father is correctly identified as "William Hicks", but his mother is listed as "Rebecca West". The informant confused her middle name for her maiden. The War of 1812 Pension Application for William Hicks (Jr.) indicates "Rebecca Alcorn" as the widow of William Hicks, and combined with the early Marriage Bond, proves that Rebecca was the wife of William throughout the marriage, and was, indeed, the mother of Rice.

Harriett Ann was born in Sparta, Gallatin Co., in May 1846. Harriett Ann reached 59 years of age and died in English, Carroll Co., on November 12, 1905. She was buried at Port Royal Cemetery in Port Royal, Henry Co.. The marriage of Harriet Swango and Rice Hicks took place at the home of Harriett's father, Henry Swango. It was witnessed by Catherine Bruce, Nancy Swango and Henry Swango. It was the first and only marriage for both. She was the daughter of Henry Swango (10) and Nancy Ann Bruce (11).

R. H. Hicks Instantly Killed by L&N Train At Worthville

Riley H. Hicks, town marshal and tax collector of Worthville, was instantly killed at 12:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon when he was struck by an L. & N. southbound freight train, his head and face being mangled beyond recognition.

In his endeavor to cross the tracks ahead of the oncoming train he started to run, but one foot was caught by the engine. The train, a through-freight, stopped as soon as possible.

Mr. Hicks was born in Gallatin county February 8, 1864, the son of Rice and Harriet Swango Hicks. Of his immediate family, three brothers survive – James Hicks, Ghent; Rice, English, and Robert, Cincinnati.

On March 8, 1893, he was married to Mrs. Mollie (Evans) Tharp, and one son born to them died in infancy. His wife passed away July 30, 1929.

On June 4, 1940, Mr. Hicks was united in marriage to Mrs. Nellie (O'Neal) Gross, who survives. He also leaves seven step children, Guy, Thomas and George Tharp, Mrs. Kathryn Gross, O'Neal, Everett and Harold Gross.

Mr. Hicks was one of Worthville's best known and highly esteemed citizens. At the age of 17 he united with the Methodist church. Later he joined the Christian church at Mill Creek, and on locating to Worthville became a charter member of the Christian church at that place. At the time of his death he was an elder in his congregation.

Funeral services were held on Monday at 3:00 p.m. in the Christian church in Worthville, conducted by his pastor, Rev. Edmond John, who was assisted by Rev. B. M. Winters, Vevay, former pastor of Worthville Methodist Church, and Rev. , pastor of the Worthville Baptist Church.

With Mrs. Charles Warren at the piano, a choir composed of Mrs. Leon Kirk, Mrs. Ellis Burton, Miss Alma Bowie, Rev. Winters and A. W. Dawkins gave several vocal selections while Rev. John sang a solo.

Honorary pallbearers were Messrs. Joseph Nevill, Samuel Booth, A. W. Dawkins, Stanley Brock, C. B. Gardner, Clinton Pollard, Active pallbearers included Messrs. Guy Tharp, C. B. Perry, N. L. Walters, George Gullion, Richard Gardner, Dewey Brock.





8. William Hicks Jr. was born on Thursday, December 04, 1794, in Jessamine Co., Kentucky. He was the son of William Hicks (16) and Mary Swango (17).

William died in Gallatin Co. on March 12, 1868, at the age of 73.

William Hicks, Jr. was the son of William and Mary (Swango) Hicks. William, Jr. and Rebecca owned two and one-half acres of land in Jessamine Co., KY and this is where his mother had lived. William, Jr. and Rebecca lived in Fayette, Gallatin, Jessamine and Harrison Counties, KY. William, Jr. served in the War of 1812 from August 1812 until November 1813, under the name William Hix. He served in the Captain Wyatt's Company, 1st Regiment of Kentucky Mounted Volunteer Militia, commanded by George Trotter in 1813, as a private.

William married Rebecca Alcorn, daughter of Robert Alcorn and Susannah Turpin, 12 Jan 1815 in Fayette County, Kentucky.

9. William married **Rebecca Alcorn** on Thursday, January 12, 1815, in Fayette Co. They had six children.

Rebecca was born in Madison Co. between 1797 and 1798. She was the daughter of Robert Alcorn (18) and Susannah Turpin (19).

Rebecca died in Warsaw, Gallatin Co., on July 17, 1875.

The Alcorn family came to America prior to 1680. The earliest records are found of a John Alcorn, who immigrated to Philadelphia, PA, from Ulster, Ireland.

Children of William Hicks Jr. and Rebecca Alcorn:

- M I. Alfred Hicks was born in Kentucky on February 10, 1812. He died in Stilesville, Hendricks Co., Indiana, on July 09, 1885, at the age of 73. Alfred was buried at Union Chapel Cemetery in Morton, Putnam Co..

Mary Ellen Hicks appears as "Mary Hicks" on the death certificate of her daughter, Martha Baker Swango, along with Martha's father, John Baker. Mary Ellen Hicks, born circa 1824, appears named as the wife of John E. Baker in the 1850 census in Gallatin County, Kentucky. The marriage of Mary Ellen Hicks and John E. Baker in Jessamine County, Kentucky, took place on 19 December 1842.

John E. Baker was killed on 14 August 1864 as seen in the deposition of his great granddaughter, Dr. Elizabeth Kaspar. Dr. Kaspar possesses a number of family mementos left to her by her mother, Catherine Edith Baker Kaspar. Among them is a framed photograph of a white bearded man and a woman. It was taken, presumably, in the latter part of the nineteenth century, as is evidenced by the clothing and hair styles, which were customary for the era. On the back of the frame, and attached to it, is an aged piece of paper, on which is written "Uncle Rice Hicks and Aunt Harriett Dad's mother's brother and his wife [signed] Julia". In another handwriting, obviously made later, are the markings "A. M. Baker" written over "Dad's" and "Mary Ellen Hicks" written over "mother's".

Rice Hicks appears in the 1850 census in Gallatin County, Kentucky, as age 16, a son of William Hicks, 60, and his wife Rebecca. Rebecca is the Rebecca Alcorn shown in the marriage bond dated 10 January 1815, Fayette County, Kentucky. Rice Hicks marries Harriett Ann Swango on 6 April 1859 in Gallatin County, Kentucky, per their marriage license and marriage certificate. Thus, this is the "Harriett" identified in the photograph.

The signature can be identified as Julia Baker, a granddaughter of Mary Ellen Hicks, and the daughter of Alexander Marshall ("A. M. Baker") Baker. The 1920 census in Louisville, Ward 3, Jefferson County, Kentucky shows Alexander Baker, his wife, Mary, and his daughter Julia, then 23. Alexander Marshall Baker appears, as well, in the 1860 census along with his sister, Martha, in Gallatin County, Kentucky.

The death certificate of Rice Hicks, dated 19 April 1915, shows his death in Jessamine County, Kentucky. His father is correctly identified as "William Hicks", but his mother is listed as "Rebecca West". The informant confused her middle name for her surname. The War of 1812 Pension Application for William Hicks (Jr.) indicates "Rebecca Alcorn" as the widow of William Hicks, and combined with the early Marriage Bond, proves that Rebecca was the wife of William throughout the marriage, and was, indeed, the mother of Rice.

Julia is identified in the graves of Resthaven Cemetery in Louisville, Kentucky as "Baker, Mattie Julia, 1894-1987, daughter of Alexander". Many of the Baker family are buried here.

Julia, born in 1894, would have been 21 at the death of her great uncle, Rice Hicks, and was therefore one of his contemporaries living in the same state relatively near him.

Despite the fact that the 1840 census in Jessamine County, Kentucky does not show the names of the members of the household of William Hicks, there are two females listed in the 16 to 20 age bracket, the same age bracket as Mary Ellen Hicks would have been in 1840.

16. William Hicks was born in 1755 in Virginia. He died in Garrard Co., Kentucky, on December 19, 1822, at the age of 67.

William and Mary (Swango) Hicks

William Hicks was born in 1755 in Virginia. While living in Virginia, he married Mary Swango on 2 January 1784. William Hicks died 19 Dec 1822 in Garrard County, Kentucky. Mary was born about. 1763/65 and died 24 Aug 1847 in Jessamine County, Kentucky. No cemetery record for Mary or William has been found in Jessamine County, Kentucky. William Hicks is listed on the 1810 census of Garrard County, Kentucky. William Hicks was not listed on the first census of Kentucky.

The Revolutionary War Pension Application

The Revolutionary War Pension Application (Pension Claim # 8931) of William Hicks contains a lot of information about William and his family. In June of 1818 William Hicks, aged about 62, stated under oath that he enlisted in the 12th Virginia Regiment, a continental establishment in Captain William McKee's Company under the command of Col. James Woods, on or along the 25 day of September 1776, for the term of two years and served out his time in the corps at the mouth of the Great Kanawha, and was regularly discharged in the fall of the year in 1778. He also stated that sometime in the year 1780 he again engaged in the second Virginia Regiment attachment under Col. Samuel Hawes and in Capt. Frank Cowherd's company and served the time of eighteen months and was discharged from the same on the 17 January 1782.

William's pension application gives the name of his wife as Mary "Swanger." Her maiden name was almost certainly Swango since there were no Swangers in Virginia at the time, but there were Swangos in the area. Mary allowed pension on her application executed 19 Nov. 1838. She was then a resident of Jessamine County, Kentucky, aged seventy-two years. An official report on file shows that she died 22 August 1847, in Jessamine County, Kentucky. In November of 1838,

Suffiah Combs, a daughter of the William and wife Mary, was a resident of Jessamine County, Kentucky. Suffiah was born 20 September 1790, and was the parent's fourth child. Her husband, Edward Combs, died in Oct. 1825.

The names and dates of the other children were shown: the first child, name not given, died when about 3 months old; Moses the next child, was born 7 Sept. 1786, Abraham was born 30th Oct. 1788; Samuel was born 16 Jan 1792; William was born 4 Dec 1794; Abaigail was born 20 May 1796.

According to correspondence in the pension file, Mary was living with here son William in Jessamine County, Kentucky in 1845.

Deposition of Suffiah Combs

The deposition of Suffiah Combs of Jessamine County, Kentucky, taken at her residence, on 07 May 1839, was used as evidence in the favor of the application of Mary, widow of William Hicks for a pension under the act of congress passed July 7, 1838. Suffiah was forty-eight years old on the 20th day of September and the fourth child of William Hicks and Mary Hicks. She states that her mother's maiden name was "Mary Swanger." (See more about this elsewhere in this article.)

She further stated that she had her father's old pocket book, which was in her possession, and which contained the family register of the marriage of her father and mother and the ages of their children-said register occupying two pages. The handwriting was that of the deponent's father and had been there since the deponent's earliest collection.

The pocket book listed the date of William and Mary's marriage and the names and dates of birth of all their children, except for their first child who died at the about the age of three months old.

17. William married **Mary Swango** on Friday, January 02, 1784, in probably Virginia. They had eight children.

Mary was born in 1766. She was the daughter of Abraham Swango (34) and Ailsie Pyles (35).

Mary reached 81 years of age and died in Jessamine Co., Kentucky, on August 24, 1847.

Mary was the granddaughter of William Swango and the daughter of Abraham Swango. Abraham Swango had a daughter referred to as Mariah who was born about the same time. Her name is listed in William Hicks' Revolutionary War pension papers as "Swanger". William Hicks was recruited for the Revolutionary War by Hugh Stephenson in Bullskin creek section of 7 May 1839.

William Hicks was recruited for the Revolutionary War by Hugh Stephenson in Bullskin creek section of Berkeley County, Virginia, now Jefferson County, West Virginia which is the same area that Hugh Stephenson and the Swangos lived and therefore lived near enough to Abraham Swango to have known his daughter, Mary/Mariah. William only had two other known children: Isaac and William. Nothing is known of their descendants. The spelling of Mary's maiden name is listed as "Swanger" in her husband's Revolutionary War pension papers and her father's last name is listed as "Swanger" in a lease of land from George Washington.There were Swangers living in this country at the same time, but none near the same area as Abraham Swango. It is possible that the family name was Swanger, but it is more likely that Swanger was simply a misspelling of an uncommon name. Descendants now use the spelling "Swango."





James Swango served in the Revolutionary War as a private in the Legion from the State of Delaware, commanded by Col Henry Lee. James enlisted before May of 1777. Following the war, James married; his wife died after 1825. Their first child was born in Virginia in 1783 before they started on the trail west. He settled near his parents near Warsaw in Gallatin County, Kentucky. He and his wife lived there the rest of their lives and reared their family there. James Swango was buried in Gallatin County, Kentucky.

An old newspaper entry was located in The Kentucky Gazette which stated: "The execution of James Swango for murder is set for December 28." A second article followed which read: "James Swango received a governor's pardon. He was to be executed for murder." Another letter was written about him being a wild and wooly individual and was once sentenced to hang at Lexington for the murder of a peddler. 30. John Meek was born about 1789 in South Carolina. He was the son of Basil Meek (60) and Sarah _____ (61).

John died in Benton Twp., Holt Co., Missouri, on December 27, 1869, at the age of 80. He was buried at Baldwin Cemetery in Holt Co..

Dr. MEEK, one of the oldest physicians in Holt Co., started practice in Mound City when the town consisted of a store, blacksmith shop and a single dwelling-house. His father, John MEEK, was born in South Carolina and, when 4 years old, moved with his father to Duck River near Nashville, Tenn., and when 18 came to Kentucky. He married Temperance LOUDON, whose family was from Virginia and whose grandfather was one of the pioneer settlers of Kentucky, and gave his name to Loudon's Station, one of the earliest settled places in the state. Dr. MEEK was born in Henry Co., Kentucky on April 22, 1826, being the sixth of ten children. He was raised in Henry Co.; the ordinary subscription schools afforded his means of obtaining an education.

His father moved the family to Mo. in 1852, settling in Holt Co. a mileand-a-half southeast of Mound City. Dr. MEEK began his studies of medicine in 1856 with Dr. Jabez ROBINSON, a practicing physician of Oregon. He afterward attended lectures at the St. Louis Medical College under Dr. Charles A. POPE and graduated in the spring of 1857; he established his practice in Mound City later that year. On April 19, 1860 he married Elizabeth A. SHARPE, the daughter of William SHARPE, one of the earliest pioneers of Union township, after whom and his brother, Sharp's Grove received its name.

Dr. MEEK practiced in Clay Co., Ill. from spring 1865 to Oct. 1866, but otherwise has been residing all the time in Holt Co. He resided in Craig

from March 1869 to March 1873, but returned to Mound City and resumed practice at the place where he first began his professional career. He is regarded as an excellent physician and is highly respected for his civic qualities. He has had four children: John W., now deceased; Gertrude; Leonidas S.; and Francis C.

Dr. MEEK has always been a member of the Democratic party and cast his first vote for President for James Buchanan in 1856. He became connected with the Masonic fraternity in 1854 and is one of the oldest Masons in the county. He originally belonged to the Oregon lodge, has been a charter member of three different lodges, and is now a member of the Mound City lodge. For ten years, Dr. MEEK practiced medicine at Mound City without a rival and was the only physician in that part of the county. He erected a brick dwelling-house in Mound City which at the time was considered quite a wonder for the elegance of its appearance, there at the time having been no such building constructed in that part of the county.

31. John married **Temperance Louden** on Friday, September 16, 1808, in Henry Co., Kentucky. They had ten children.

Temperance was born in Virginia about 1790. She was the daughter of Robert Louden (62) and Elizabeth Wilson (63).

Temperance reached 55 years of age and died in Henry Co., Kentucky, on July 31, 1845.

The parents of Temperance are a total guess at this point. I have also seen her father listed as Barry Louden, but I have not found any records to support this.



Family of Abraham Swango and Ailsie Pyles

34. Abraham Swango was born in 1730 in Bavaria, Germany. He was the son of William Swango (68).

Abraham worked as a Wagon maker. He died in Warsaw, Gallatin Co., Kentucky, on March 18, 1785, at the age of 55. Abraham was buried at near in Warsaw.

Tradition has it that William Swango, his wife and sons, migrated from Germany, on "The Saint Andrew" ship on 20 October 1747. The ship's sailing originated in Rotterdam, Holland via Leith, Scotand and was captained by James Abercrombie. Jacob, son of William, signed the oath of allegiance as "Jacob Schwanger." Further tradition has it that William's wife died on the journey to America and was buried at sea. William and Abraham landed at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and shortly after thereafter, William died. Jacob Schwanger who immigrated in 1747 is not our Swango Family. Annette Kunselman Burgert in her book Eighteenth Century Emigrants from the Northern Alsace to America has a more detail listing of passengers on that ship.

Other passengers on the ship (unnamed in Ms. Burgert's book) that arrived on October 20, 1747 were his wife, Maria Leyenberger Schwanger of Hellgering and children Johann Peter (born "29 May 1740), Maria Magdalena (born 1 Jan 1742), Jacob (born 5 May 1743), Isaac (born 25 Nov 1744) and Catharina (born 19 Oct 1746). This listing is based on church records in Germany. Ms. Burgert's book also goes on to add information from church records after they arrived in Philadelphia. Jacob and his wife had a daughter Anna Maria baptized 22 Oct 1749, a daughter Eva Elizabeth born 26 Aug 1751 and baptized 4 Nov. 1751, and a son Abraham born 16 Feb 1757 and baptisted 20 Mar 1757.

An Abraham Swanger was listed in the 1782 Virginia tax list along with his brother Jacob in Berkeley County (now Jefferson Co. West Virginia.). Source: Virginia Tax Payers 1782-1787 Other than those Published by the United States Census Bureau, by Augusta B. Fothergill and John Mark Naugle, Richmond, Virginia: 1940, page 122). Other researchers have assumed this is Abraham and Jacob Swango. It is probably not. The surnames Swanger and Swango were two distinct surnames by this period of time. These two brothers are probably the sons of the Jacob Schwanger who arrived in Philadelphia on October 20, 1747 via Rotterdam discussed above.

The name Swango has been anglicized from the German name Schwangau, which means "swan land" and is probably taken from Schwangau, Bavaria, Germany. The name Swango is not interchangeable with Swanger which was anglicized from the German name Schwanger.

By tradition, Abraham, only 14 years of age when he arrived, was apprenticed to a wagon maker, whom he served until age 21. He became a wagon maker by trade.

I have found no evidence that Abraham's father was William or that he had brothers Isaac and Jacob. Based on long standing family tradition I have included them in this listing. Other researchers have provided that Abraham's mother was Mary Agnes Oesing. I have found nothing to support this.

In 1760, Abraham married Ailsie Pyle in the Old Swedes Church in Wilmington, Delaware. Ailsie was born in Ireland and lived in the Mt. Vernon neighborhood at the time of her marriage to Abraham. In both Pennsylvania and Virginia, Abraham has Pyle neighbors. His wife, Alisie Pyle was a Quaker, as evidenced by some records in both Pennsylavania and Virginia. She probably is the descendant of the Pyle family that came from England with William Penn.

Abraham and Ailsie lived in Frederick County, Virginia after their marriage. In 1769 he signed the lease with George Washington for property in Frederick County, Virginia. (Source: Frederick County, Virginia Deed Book Series, Volume 4, Deed Books 12, 13, 14, 1767-1771, by Ameila C. Gilreath, Willow Bend Books, Westminster, Maryland, 2001, page 86). The lease called for building of buildings, clearing of land, setting fruit trees all according to a plan laid down by Washington. George Washington considered Germans as the finest of farmers and therefore he had a rather large number of them on his various land holdings throughout Virginia.

Abraham migrated to Kentucky around 1785 with Ailsie and their four sons and three daughters. Samuel, Abraham and Ailsie's oldest son,

stopped in the area of Red River, present Powell County, because of the excellent hunting. The remainder of the family, including their son James who we are descended from, moved on to near Lexington where they remained for two years. Then they migrated on to present Gallatin County, Kentucky where Abraham and Ailsie are both buried a short distance from Warsaw.

35. Abraham married **Ailsie Pyles** on Monday, April 14, 1760, in Wilmington, New Castle Co., Delaware. They had seven children.

Ailsie was born in Delaware about 1738. She reached 52 years of age and died in Gallatin Co., Kentucky, about 1790. Ailsie was buried at near in Warsaw, Gallatin Co..

Children of Abraham Swango and Ailsie Pyles:

+ 20 m I. **James Swango** was born in Kent Co. about 1762. He died in Gallatin Co., Kentucky, between 1825 and 1830.

James Swango, son of Abraham and Ailsie Pyles Swango, was born about 1762 in Kent County, Delaware and died in 1827 in Gallatin County, Kentucky James Swango married Lydia (last name unknown at this time) about 1780. Lydia was born about 1760 in Virginia..

James Swango served in the Revolutionary War as a private in the Legion from the State of Delaware, commanded by Col Henry Lee. James enlisted before May of 1777. Following the war, James married; his wife died after 1825. Their first child was born in Virginia in 1783 before they started on the trail west. He settled near his parents near Warsaw in Gallatin County, Kentucky. He and his wife lived there the rest of their lives and reared their family there. James Swango was buried in Gallatin County, Kentucky.

An old newspaper entry was located in The Kentucky Gazette which stated: "The execution of James Swango for murder is set for December 28." A second article followed which read: "James Swango received a governor's pardon. He was to be executed for murder."

Another letter was written about him being a wild and wooly individual and was once sentenced to hang at Lexington for the murder of a peddler. Before the time of execution another man on his death bed confessed to the crime and old Jim was pardoned.. m II. **Samuel Swango** was born about 1765. Mt. Vernon, Virginia on farm owed by George Washington. He died in Morgan Co., Kentucky, about 1850 at the age of 85.

Samuel came to Kentucky in 1785, or about that date, and located on a farm in Fayette Co., now Powell Co., KY. He continued to reside there for about 25 years, when he moved to Wolfe Co., and died at an advanced age.

+ 17 f III. **Mary Swango** was born in 1766. She died in Jessamine Co., Kentucky, on August 24, 1847, at the age of 81.

Mary was the granddaughter of William Swango and the daughter of Abraham Swango. Abraham Swango had a daughter referred to as Mariah who was born about the same time. Her name is listed in William Hicks' Revolutionary War pension papers as "Swanger". William Hicks was recruited for the Revolutionary War by Hugh Stephenson in Bullskin creek section of 7 May 1839.

William Hicks was recruited for the Revolutionary War by Hugh Stephenson in Bullskin creek section of Berkeley County, Virginia, now Jefferson County, West Virginia which is the same area that Hugh Stephenson and the Swangos lived and therefore lived near enough to Abraham Swango to have known his daughter, Mary/Mariah. William only had two other known children: Isaac and William. Nothing is known of their descendants. The spelling of Mary's maiden name is listed as "Swanger" in her husband's Revolutionary War pension papers and her father's last name is listed as "Swanger" in a lease of land from George Washington. There were Swangers living in this country at the same time, but none near the same area as Abraham Swango. It is possible that the family name was Swanger, but it is more likely that Swanger was simply a misspelling of an uncommon name. Descendants now use the spelling "Swango."

- m IV. **Abraham Swango** was born in Mt. Vernon, Frederick Co., Virginia, about 1766. He died in Boone, Gallatin Co., Kentucky, in 1790 at the age of 24.

Witnesseth that the aforesaid William and Jacob, for, and in consideration of the Sum of one dollar to them in hand the Receipt hereof they do hereby acknowledge both granted bargained & sold, alined and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant, bargain and seal, aline and confirm, unto the aforesaid Hugh JACKSON a certain tract or parcel of Land situate lving and being on the Waters of CRAIGS Creek in the aforesaid County of Gallatin being part of MAY BANISTER & Company's survey of 22,283 acres and included in a deed made to the above parties by Patrick HENDREN and bounded as follows:

Beginning at two ashes and poplar a corner to the Lott No. 36—thence S. 18 degrees 45 minutes E. 113 ½ poles to a hickory and two Dogwoods—thence N. 71 Degrees 15 Minutes E. 140 poles to two ashes and three Dogwood & Beech—thence N. 18 Degrees 45 Minutes W. 113 ½ poles to two Beeches & Dogwood a corner of Jacob JACKSON'S land, thence S. 71 degrees 15 minutes W. 141 poles to the Beginning, Containing by Survey, One hundred acres.

To have and to hold the aforesaid tract of Land with its appurtenances unto the aforesaid Hugh JACKSON, his heirs or assigns—to his and their duly proper use and likes of forever, and the aforesaid Williams SWANGO and Jacob JACKSON their heirs Executors or Administrators the aforesaid tract of Land with its appurtenances unto the aforesaid Hugh JACKSON, his heirs or assigns shall & will warrant and forever defend against the claim, or claims of the assigns, their heirs, Executors or Administrators or any other person or persons claiming in through or under them, but shall be under no responsibility as to the claim or claims of any other person or persons whatsoever. In Testimony whereof the aforesaid William SWANGO and Jacob JACKSON hath hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written.



36. John Alcorn was born in 1745 in Wythe Co., Virginia. He was the son of James Alcorn (72) and Jane _____ (73).

John served in the military between 1777 and 1778. Revolutionary War. He died at near in Fayette Co., Kentucky, after 1804.

The James Alcorn who married Jane Mills and the John Alcorn who married Jane Breckenridge were brothers. The above four lived in and owned land in what is now Botetourt Co., VA before moving to what is now Wythe Co., VA in the 1770's. James Allcorn bought 143 acres and 37.5 acres in Augusta Co., VA (now Botetourt Co.) in 1768 and 1769. the 143 acres from John and Mary Mills. James and Jinny Alcorn sold 180 acres (the combined 143 & 37.5 acres) in Botetourt in 1779. James Alcorn received a warrant for 50 acres in Montgomery Co., VA (now Wythe Co.) on Mac's Little Run, joining his own and John Miller and the Anchor & Hope Plantation on or near Reed Creek. The above warrant was in Montgomery Co., VA for service in the French and Indian War.

James Alcorn was killed in the Battle of Guilford Courthouse, NC in 1781 or the skirmishes that led up to that battle. His widow Jane and Charles Hutcherson were married in 1788 in Montgomery Co., VA by Rev. Richard Whitt and they later moved to Madison Co., KY.

John and Jane (Breckenridge) Alcorn also moved to Madison Co., KY as can be proven per Wythe Co., Va deeds. John Allcorn bought 120 acres in 1765 near where his brother James later lived in Augusta Co. (now Botetourt Co.), VA John and his wife, Jane (dau. of George and Ann (Doak) Breckenridge), sold their 120 acres in 1770. John Alcorn bought 201 acres on Lucas Creek, east of Wytheville, Montgomery Co. (now Wythe Co.) VA and near Anchor & Hope, in 1778. Now this is where Wythe Co. deeds were especially helpful. On 02 Sep 1782, Joh Allcorn, senior, sold 39 acres (of the 201 acres) on Reed Creek (Lucas Creek runs into Reed Creek) to John Alcorn, son of James Alcorn, deceased. John Miller also sold John (son of James, deceased) 44 acres on Lucas Creek on the same date. John (son of James) sold the 83 acres (39 + 44) on 06 Oct 1788. (This is the same year that Jane, James' widow got married and could have been about when they moved to Madison Co., KY).

John (son of James, deceased) had problems with the sale of the 83 acres. John had 1st gone to Madison Co., KY where he married Nancy Mounce, had 3 kids, divorced and went to Wilson Co., TN. He married 2nd, Prudence Hall. The above problem with the deed helped to locate John (son of James, deceased) as living in Wilson Co., TN in 1802. Wythe Co., VA Deed Book 3, pg 220, 23 Feb 1802: John Alcorn, clerk of the Wilson Co., TN Court, gave Robert Wilson, of Wythe Co., VA power of attorney to act in John's behalf on the 83 acres recorded on 03 Mar 1789. This document not only shows where John lived in 1802, but also gives his occupation in 1802 as court clerk (a job he held for many years). There is a follow-up similar record in Deed Book 3, pg 231, 12 Mar 1802. Property descriptions are included. John lived in, raised his 2nd family in, and is buried in Wilson Co., TN.

John and Jane (Breckenridge) Allcorn of Madison Co., KY, sold 161 acres in Wythe Co., VA to John Miller of Wythe Co., VA This was the balance of the above 201 acres after selling the above 39 acres to John (son of James, deceased). A problem developed on this propery too. (Wythe Co., VA Deed Book 1, pgs 101-102, 210, and 295-296, 23 Aug 1792, 04 Dec 1793 and 12 Aug 1794). As John Alcorn and Jane his wife were living in Madison Co., KY, they gave Robert Breckenridge (probably Jane (Breckenridge) Alcorn's brother, who was living in Wythe Co., and later died in Bath Co., KY in 1814), power of attorney to act in their behalf on the 161 acres. Witnesses were George, James and John Allcorn (possibly John & Jane's sons). So John and Jane Allcorn also went to Madison Co., KY.

John Alcorn actively participated in the affairs of Montgomery County, Virginia, for more than ten years, from 1770 to 1782.

John was born about 1734, perhaps in Virginia; his activities were being recorded in 1758 when he reported an Indian raid on his home. John was a soldier in the First Virginia Regiment during the Cherokee expedition in 1760. His activities as a land dealer, a soldier, and in the county civic

operations were recorded in Fincastle, Botetourt, and Montgomery counties of southwest Virginia.

John married Jane Breckenridge, daughter of George Breckenridge and Ann Doakes about 1769. Jane was born about 1751. The Botetourt County records show John Alcorn and his wife, Jane, bought 120 acres of land on Looney's Creek on May the Second 1770 for £50. The records of May 5, 1773, show that the Court of Fincastle County, Virginia, assigned John Alcorn and others to assess the feasibility of building a proposed road in Fincastle County.

John took the oath of Ensign in the Virginia militia on May 5, 1778. He was assigned to Captain John Montgomery's company. This took place in the Court of Montgomery County, Virginia. On December 1, 1778

John Alcorn bought 201 acres of land in Montgomery County. John's name appeared on the docket of the grand jurors of Montgomery County on November 2, 1779. On May 3, 1780, John Alcorn, John Bethel, and others were awarded 40 acres each in the Montgomery County Court for army service under Colonel George Washington. The claimants were represented before the court by Patrick Henry.

On September 2, 1782, John Alcorn Sr., sold 39 acres of land on Reed's Creek, Montgomery County, Virginia, to John Alcorn, the son of James Alcorn. On the same day John, the son of James, bought 44 acres on Reed's Creek from John Mills, his grandfather.

According to the annals of South West Virginia, John Alcorn was certified as a lieutenant of the Virginia militia on November 28 1786. John moved

his family to Madison County Kentucky about 1788. He was listed as a taxpayer of Madison County in 1789. In 1793 John gave Robert Breckenridge, his brother-in-law, power of attorney to dispose of property for him in Wythe County, Virginia. I believe this transaction was made to

settle the estate of George Breckenridge.

The children of John and Jane were, I believe, John Jr.; George; Robert; and two or three daughters whom I have been unable to identify. The records list many Alcorn girls as having married from 1789 to 1799 in Mercer, Madison, Garrard, and Lincoln Counties, and it is hard to say whose children they were. John Jr. was born about 1770. He was shown as a taxpayer in Madison County in 1800. I think he moved to Mason County by 1810, and then to Jefferson County Indiana by 1820.

The Kentucky census of 1800 shows a Robert Alcorn as head of a family in Mercer County, a Robert Alcorn as head of a family in Garrard County, and a Robert Alcorn as head of a family in Jessamine County. I believe that the Robert in Garrard County was the son of John Alcorn Sr., that the

Robert Alcorn in Mercer County was the son of Robert Alcorn Sr., who died in 1797, and that the Robert in Jessamine County could have been he son of William, George, or James.

The Kentucky census of 1800 also shows a George Alcorn in Madison County, and the 1810 census of Madison County shows a George Alcorn, a wife, and eight children. This George, I believe, was the son of John Alcorn Sr., and was probably named for his grandfather, George Breckenridge. The 1800 census of Kentucky also shows a George Alcorn in Jessamine County as head of a family, and a George Alcorn in Pulaski County. One of these, I believe to be the George Alcorn who was born in Pee Dee, North Carolina in 1760; the other perhaps was his son.

The same census shows a James Alcorn as head of a family in Anderson County and a James Alcorn in Mercer County as head of a family. The James Alcorn in Mercer County was probably the son of Robert Alcorn Sr. The 1800 census shows a Thomas Alcorn in Madison County, and a William Alcorn as heads of families. William and Thomas, I believe were the sons of Robert Alcorn Sr.

John Alcorn Sr. was active in the formation of Garrard County in 1796, and was appointed a Justice of the County at the time.



38. William Robert Turpin was born in 1749 in Chesterfield Co., Virginia. He was the son of Henry W. Turpin (76) and Ann Williamson (77).

William Robert died in Henderson Co., Kentucky, on November 22, 1824, at the age of 75. He was buried at Panther Creek Baptist Church Cemetery in Whitesville, Daviess Co..

William Turpin was the proven father of Susannah Turpin Welch Alcorn. Problem is no one seems to know which William Turpin is her real father.

We know that William was alive as late as 23 May 1796 as he gave the clerk permission to issue a license for marriage of his daughter Susanna Welch to marry Robert Alcorn.

William Turpin who left a will in 1816, Garrard County, Kentucky is not the father of our Susannah. Although this William Turpin did have a daughter named Susanna in his will this is not our Susannah for one main reason. The Susanna in his will is still single and proof of that is that he had 2 married daughters in 1816. If this Susannah was married she would have been referred to by her married name.

Still others have insisted that William Turpin who left a will dated 22 November 1824 is our William. This William states in his will he has 5 heirs, even naming his deceased daughter, but he has no daughter named Susannah. He even goes as far to name a deceased brother in his Will. There is no mention of a daughter named Susan/ Susannah etc or the married name Alcorn in this Will.

39. At the age of 24, William Robert married **Sarah Harris** on Monday, June 28, 1773, in Cumberland Co., Virginia, when she was 19 years old. They had eight children.

Sarah was born in Cumberland Co. on Thursday, January 17, 1754. She was the daughter of William Harris (78) and Elizabeth Evans (79).

Sarah reached 103 years of age and died in Henderson Co., Kentucky, in 1858. She was buried at Panther Creek Baptist Church Cemetery in Whitesville, Daviess Co..







Elisha Bishop served in the Rev. War. John came to Kentucky with his parents, brothers Edward and James. The first settled in Fayette County in 1793, then they moved to Henry County, Kentucky, in 1807. Information was provided by Virginia Tolman.

m II. **Edward Tingle** was born in 1794. Worcheser Co., MD (now Sussex Co., DE). He died in Henry Co. in September 1858 at the age of 64.

Edward served in the War of 1812, enlisting on August 27, 1813. He served until November 9, 1813. Edward Tingle, Wid. 5314., Private, Capt. Edw. George's Company, Ky. Mil.; Capt. Heddon's Co., Ky. Militia. Was in the Division commanded by Gov. Shelby, near the Battle of the Thames in Canada. Edward Tingle was the son of Littleton Tingle, born in 1794 in Maryland, came to Kentucky with his father in 1794 as an infant. Littleton moved to Henry Co, in 1806-1807 where he died. Edward married Eleanor Bishop daughter of Elisha Bishop who served in the Revolutionary War from Virginia. Edward died in Henry County, Kentucky, and his wife applied for a widow's pension after his death. Information was provided by Virginia Tolman.



Family of Elisha Bishop and Elizabeth Ellis



50. Elisha Bishop was born in 1760 in Anne Arundel Co., Maryland. He was the son of Thomas John Bishop (100) and Sarah Bouton (101).

Elisha died in Henry Co., Kentucky, in 1809 at the age of 49.

Elisha Bishop served in the Revolutionary War. He lived in Frederick County, VA when he entered the service in Berkeley Co., VA, as a substitute for his father Thomas Bishop' in March 1777; under Captain Thomas Catlett for a tour of six months. He served with his brother Solomon Bishop. When they were discharged Solomon returned home but Elisha reenlisted and remained in New Jersey with his Company. He served under Captain Catlett for 2 years according to the records and was discharged Sept 1779. He was in the battle of Stoney Point, NY and the expedition of Paulus Hook, N.J.

In 1780 he moved to that area of Virginia which later became Woodford Co., Kentucky.9 In March 1781 he enlisted for a tour of 6 months under Captain Berry as a private against the Indians. In September 1782 he again enlisted for a tour of 6 months under Captain Callaway as a scout and a spy against the Indians.

Those persons who signed with him were his neighbors Charles Hughley and William McCracken. William McCracken was his brotherin-law having married Elizabeth's younger sister, Lindsey Ellis 28 Jul 1800 in Woodford Co. At the time of his application, there was no clergyman in the neighborhood where he was living although he was a member of the Baptist Church. Other persons who gave affidavits were Thomas Smith, whose brother George had served with Elisha. Mary Smith wife of Thomas, states that Elisha visited her father's home in Frederick Co., VA, while on furlough. Stephen Bowen, Francis E. Skidmore and Elisabeth Skidmore all state in 1833 that Elisha Bishop was a member of the Baptist Church for the last 20 years.

He received a land Warrant for his services in the Revolutionary War.

He married 13 Apr 1786 to Elizabeth Ellis daughter of William Ellis and Caroline Hancock in Frederick Co., VA.

In 1799/1800 he moved from Woodford Co. to Clark Co., KY, where his brothers Benjamin and Thomas Bishop were living. Benjamin married Elizabeth Ballard in Clark County. His brother Michael was living in Henry County as well as the Ellises who had moved from Woodford County to Henry County. Michael fnally persuaded his brothers to move from Clark County to Henry County, which they all did in 1806. Elisha Bishop could not read or write but he was still a shrewd business man investing in land in Henry County with relatives and friends and he was a neighbor of Littleton Tingle. Due to the lack of schools available in early Henry County, he along with Littleton Tingle hired a tutor to teach their combined families in which all of their children learned to read and write. He had the help of his sons-in-law Edward Tingle, John Tingle, Henry Suddeth, nephews Jonathan Ellis, William Ellis and others when it came to matters of business as cosigners on mortgages, etc. Due to a funny Kentucky law, deeds on land do not have to be recorded unless the land goes out of the family; then the deed -must be recorded. Sometimes families will go ahead and record the deeds but not always. For example Elisha Bishop either sold or gave to his son Elisha Bishop Jr a tract of land, there is no deed but in 1828, Elisha Bishop Jr. took out a mortgage and the mortgage states "a certain tract of land conveyed to him by Elisha Bishop Senr." Number of acres not given. I know that Elisha Bishop purchased along with others 9000 acres and Elisha's share would be over 1000 acres plus his warrant. I've only found one deed on that land when Elisha Bishop sold 175 acres to his son-in-law John Tingle. When I was in Kentucky in 1970, I visited with a distant-relative and he was living on 100 acres that he received from his mother who had received it from her father who gave each of his 10 children 100 acres each. No deeds on the land but I know that both of his great-grandfathers were Littleton Tingle and Elisha Bishop and both of them had purchased large tracts of land-but not together.

Elisha Bishop died in either late 1843 or early 1844.

Disposition from Leonard Ellis' Pension File

The disposition of Elizabeth Bishop taken at the house of Elisha Bishop in Henry County, Kentucky on the 5th day of Oct 1833, who being first duly sworn according to law states that she was well acquainted with Leonard Ellis decd of Henry County Ky in his lifetime. That the said Leonard Ellis departed this life sometime in August last and that prior to his death he was making as she understood an application to be placed on the pension roll of the United States as a soldier of the Revolution.

She further states that the said Leonard Ellis at the time of his death left a widow by name Jane Ellis who still survives. She also states that she is the daughter of William Ellis who was a Brother of the said Leonard Ellis and that she is now about 64 years of age and was a girl of tolerable size for a child during the revolutionary war that about that period and during said War she frequently saw her Uncle Leonard Ellis. She recollects distinctly of seeing the said Leonard Ellis at one time during the War of the Revolution start from home prepared to enter the army and with the reprep? Design of doing so. She cannot say who his officers were nor for what length of time he entered the army but she knows that he was gone for some time. She further states that she has understood from him and others of the family and relations during the time of the said War that he served in other tours besides that afore which she saw him start as above named. She is confident from what she saw, and heard about the matter that the said Leonard Ellis did serve several tours of duty during the revolutionary War.

Swore to and subscribed the day and year aforesaid. Elizabeth (x her mark) Bishop

Also the disposition of Elisha Bishop taken at the same time and place and for the same purpose who being first duly sworn upon his oath states that he was well acquainted with Leonard Ellis spoken of in the above disposition of his wife Elizabeth Bishop that he this deponent married into the family 47 years ago and he was from that period up to this time understood from the said Leonard Ellis and his brother William Ellis, who was the father of this deponents wife, that the said Leonard Ellis did serve in the army of the revolution. He has also heard the same thing from others and he has no doubt upon his word from what he has understood and from conversations which he this deponent had had with the said Leonard that he did serve in the army of the revolution. And he is confident that he must have been in the service at the taking of Cornwallis.


Dr. MEEK, one of the oldest physicians in Holt Co., started practice in Mound City when the town consisted of a store, blacksmith shop and a single dwelling-house. His father, John MEEK, was born in South Carolina and, when 4 years old, moved with his father to Duck River near Nashville, Tenn., and when 18 came to Kentucky. He married Temperance LOUDON, whose family was from Virginia and whose grandfather was one of the pioneer settlers of Kentucky, and gave his name to Loudon's Station, one of the earliest settled places in the state. Dr. MEEK was born in Henry Co., Kentucky on April 22, 1826, being the sixth of ten children. He was raised in Henry Co.; the ordinary subscription schools afforded his means of obtaining an education.

His father moved the family to Mo. in 1852, settling in Holt Co. a mile-and-a-half southeast of Mound City. Dr. MEEK began his studies of medicine in 1856 with Dr. Jabez ROBINSON, a practicing physician of Oregon. He afterward attended lectures at the St. Louis Medical College under Dr. Charles A. POPE and graduated in the spring of 1857; he established his practice in Mound City later that year. On April 19, 1860 he married Elizabeth A. SHARPE, the daughter of William SHARPE, one of the earliest pioneers of Union township, after whom and his brother, Sharp's Grove received its name.

Dr. MEEK practiced in Clay Co., Ill. from spring 1865 to Oct. 1866, but otherwise has been residing all the time in Holt Co. He resided in Craig from March 1869 to March 1873, but returned to Mound City and resumed practice at the place where he first began his professional career. He is regarded as an excellent physician and is highly respected for his civic qualities. He has had four children: John W., now deceased; Gertrude; Leonidas S.; and Francis C.

Dr. MEEK has always been a member of the Democratic party and cast his first vote for President for James Buchanan in 1856. He became connected with the Masonic

fraternity in 1854 and is one of the oldest Masons in the county. He originally belonged to the Oregon lodge, has been a charter member of three different lodges, and is now a member of the Mound City lodge. For ten years, Dr. MEEK practiced medicine at Mound City without a rival and was the only physician in that part of the county. He erected a brick dwelling-house in Mound City which at the time was considered quite a wonder for the elegance of its appearance, there at the time having been no such building constructed in that part of the county.

William Swango

68. William Swango was born in 1698 in Bavaria, Germany.

William Swango, his wife and son, Abraham immigrated from Germany around the year 1741. The name Swango is from the german name Schwangau, which means - swan land. William's wife died during their journey to America and was buried at sea. William and Abraham landed in Philadelphia, PA. Abraham was about 14 years old at the time and apprenticed as a wagon maker, which became his trade. Abraham and his wife Ailsie Pyle, who was born in Ireland, moved to Fredrick Co, Virginia, where he was a lessee of George Washington. He built buildings, cleared land and planted fruit trees. Abraham was a private during the Revolutionary War in the Virginia line. Abraham and his wife Ailsie are both buried near Warsaw, Gallatin Co, Kentucky.

Sons of William Swango:

+ 34 m I. **Abraham Swango** was born in Bavaria in 1730. He died in Warsaw, Gallatin Co., Kentucky, on March 18, 1785, at the age of 55.

Tradition has it that William Swango, his wife and sons, migrated from Germany, on "The Saint Andrew" ship on 20 October 1747. The ship's sailing originated in Rotterdam, Holland via Leith, Scotand and was captained by James Abercrombie. Jacob, son of William, signed the oath of allegiance as "Jacob Schwanger." Further tradition has it that William's wife died on the journey to America and was buried at sea. William and Abraham landed at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and shortly after thereafter, William died. Jacob Schwanger who immigrated in 1747 is not our Swango Family. Annette Kunselman Burgert in her book Eighteenth Century Emigrants from the Northern Alsace to America has a more detail listing of passengers on that ship.

Other passengers on the ship (unnamed in Ms. Burgert's book) that arrived on October 20, 1747 were his wife, Maria Leyenberger Schwanger of Hellgering and children Johann Peter (born "29 May 1740), Maria Magdalena (born 1 Jan 1742), Jacob (born 5 May 1743), Isaac (born 25 Nov 1744) and Catharina (born 19 Oct 1746). This listing is based on church records in Germany. Ms. Burgert's book also goes on to add information from church records after

they arrived in Philadelphia. Jacob and his wife had a daughter Anna Maria baptized 22 Oct 1749, a daughter Eva Elizabeth born 26 Aug 1751 and baptized 4 Nov. 1751, and a son Abraham born 16 Feb 1757 and baptisted 20 Mar 1757.

An Abraham Swanger was listed in the 1782 Virginia tax list along with his brother Jacob in Berkeley County (now Jefferson Co. West Virginia.). Source: Virginia Tax Payers 1782-1787 Other than those Published by the United States Census Bureau, by Augusta B. Fothergill and John Mark Naugle, Richmond, Virginia: 1940, page 122). Other researchers have assumed this is Abraham and Jacob Swango. It is probably not. The surnames Swanger and Swango were two distinct surnames by this period of time. These two brothers are probably the sons of the Jacob Schwanger who arrived in Philadelphia on October 20, 1747 via Rotterdam discussed above.

The name Swango has been anglicized from the German name Schwangau, which means "swan land" and is probably taken from Schwangau, Bavaria, Germany. The name Swango is not interchangeable with Swanger which was anglicized from the German name Schwanger.

By tradition, Abraham, only 14 years of age when he arrived, was apprenticed to a wagon maker, whom he served until age 21. He became a wagon maker by trade.

I have found no evidence that Abraham's father was William or that he had brothers Isaac and Jacob. Based on long standing family tradition I have included them in this listing. Other researchers have provided that Abraham's mother was Mary Agnes Oesing. I have found nothing to support this.

In 1760, Abraham married Ailsie Pyle in the Old Swedes Church in Wilmington, Delaware. Ailsie was born in Ireland and lived in the Mt. Vernon neighborhood at the time of her marriage to Abraham. In both Pennsylvania and Virginia, Abraham has Pyle neighbors. His wife, Alisie Pyle was a Quaker, as evidenced by some records in both Pennsylavania and Virginia. She probably is the descendant of the Pyle family that came from England with William Penn.


Abraham and Ailsie lived in Frederick County, Virginia after their marriage. In 1769 he signed the lease with George Washington for property in Frederick County, Virginia. (Source: Frederick County, Virginia Deed Book Series, Volume 4, Deed Books 12, 13, 14, 1767-1771, by Ameila C. Gilreath, Willow Bend Books, Westminster, Maryland, 2001, page 86). The lease called for building of buildings, clearing of land, setting fruit trees all according to a plan laid down by Washington. George Washington considered Germans as the finest of farmers and therefore he had a rather large number of them on his various land holdings throughout Virginia.

Abraham migrated to Kentucky around 1785 with Ailsie and their four sons and three daughters. Samuel, Abraham and Ailsie's oldest son, stopped in the area of Red River, present Powell County, because of the excellent hunting. The remainder of the family, including their son James who we are descended from, moved on to near Lexington where they remained for two years. Then they migrated on to present Gallatin County, Kentucky where Abraham and Ailsie are both buried a short distance from Warsaw.

m II. Jacob Swango was born about 1730.

Jacob migrated from Germany, probably on "The Saint Andrew" ship on 20 October 1747, with his father William and bothers Abraham and Issac. The ship's sailing originated in Rotterdam, Holland via Leith, Scotand and was captained by James Abercrombie. Jacob signed the oath of allegiance as "Jacob Schwanger." Also listed as passengers traveling with Jacob were: Wife Schwanger, Maria Leyenberger; Child Schwanger, Johann Peter; Child Schwanger, Maria Magdalena; Child Schwanger, Isaac; Child Schwanger, Catharina; Child Schwanger, Jacob.

72. James Alcorn was born about 1722 in Cumberland Co, Pennsylvania. He was the son of James Alcorn (144) and Mary _____ (145).

James served in the military. French and Indian Wars.

73. He married **Jane** _____. They had five children.

Children of James Alcorn and Jane _____:

+ 36 m I. **John Alcorn** was born in Wythe Co., Virginia, in 1745. He died in Fayette Co., Kentucky, after 1804.

The James Alcorn who married Jane Mills and the John Alcorn who married Jane Breckenridge were brothers. The above four lived in and owned land in what is now Botetourt Co., VA before moving to what is now Wythe Co., VA in the 1770's. James Allcorn bought 143 acres and 37.5 acres in Augusta Co., VA (now Botetourt Co.) in 1768 and 1769. the 143 acres from John and Mary Mills. James and Jinny Alcorn sold 180 acres (the combined 143 & 37.5 acres) in Botetourt in 1779. James Alcorn received a warrant for 50 acres in Montgomery Co., VA (now Wythe Co.) on Mac's Little Run, joining his own and John Miller and the Anchor & Hope Plantation on or near Reed Creek. The above warrant was in Montgomery Co., VA for service in the French and Indian War.

James Alcorn was killed in the Battle of Guilford Courthouse, NC in 1781 or the skirmishes that led up to that battle. His widow Jane and Charles Hutcherson were married in 1788 in Montgomery Co., VA by Rev. Richard Whitt and they later moved to Madison Co., KY.

John and Jane (Breckenridge) Alcorn also moved to Madison Co., KY as can be proven per Wythe Co., Va deeds. John

Allcorn bought 120 acres in 1765 near where his brother James later lived in Augusta Co. (now Botetourt Co.), VA John and his wife, Jane (dau. of George and Ann (Doak) Breckenridge), sold their 120 acres in 1770. John Alcorn bought 201 acres on Lucas Creek, east of Wytheville, Montgomery Co. (now Wythe Co.) VA and near Anchor & Hope, in 1778. Now this is where Wythe Co. deeds were especially helpful. On 02 Sep 1782, Joh Allcorn, senior, sold 39 acres (of the 201 acres) on Reed Creek (Lucas Creek runs into Reed Creek) to John Alcorn, son of James Alcorn, deceased. John Miller also sold John (son of James, deceased) 44 acres on Lucas Creek on the same date. John (son of James) sold the 83 acres (39 + 44) on 06 Oct 1788. (This is the same year that Jane, James' widow got married and could have been about when they moved to Madison Co., KY).

John (son of James, deceased) had problems with the sale of the 83 acres. John had 1st gone to Madison Co., KY where he married Nancy Mounce, had 3 kids, divorced and went to Wilson Co., TN. He married 2nd, Prudence Hall. The above problem with the deed helped to locate John (son of James, deceased) as living in Wilson Co., TN in 1802. Wythe Co., VA Deed Book 3, pg 220, 23 Feb 1802: John Alcorn, clerk of the Wilson Co., TN Court, gave Robert Wilson, of Wythe Co., VA power of attorney to act in John's behalf on the 83 acres recorded on 03 Mar 1789. This document not only shows where John lived in 1802, but also gives his occupation in 1802 as court clerk (a job he held for many years). There is a follow-up similar record in Deed Book 3, pg 231, 12 Mar 1802. Property descriptions are included. John lived in, raised his 2nd family in, and is buried in Wilson Co., TN.

John and Jane (Breckenridge) Allcorn of Madison Co., KY, sold 161 acres in Wythe Co., VA to John Miller of Wythe Co., VA This was the balance of the above 201 acres after selling the above 39 acres to John (son of James, deceased). A problem developed on this propery too. (Wythe Co., VA Deed Book 1, pgs 101-102, 210, and 295-296, 23 Aug 1792, 04 Dec 1793 and 12 Aug 1794). As John Alcorn and Jane his wife were living in Madison Co., KY, they gave Robert Breckenridge (probably Jane (Breckenridge) Alcorn's brother, who was living in Wythe Co., and later died in Bath Co., KY in 1814), power of attorney to act in their behalf on the 161 acres. Witnesses were George, James and John Allcorn (possibly John & Jane's sons). So John and Jane Allcorn also went to Madison Co., KY.

John Alcorn actively participated in the affairs of Montgomery County, Virginia, for more than ten years, from 1770 to 1782.

John was born about 1734, perhaps in Virginia; his activities were being recorded in 1758 when he reported an Indian raid on his home. John was a soldier in the First Virginia Regiment during the Cherokee expedition in 1760. His activities as a land dealer, a soldier, and in the county civic

operations were recorded in Fincastle, Botetourt, and Montgomery counties of southwest Virginia.

John married Jane Breckenridge, daughter of George Breckenridge and Ann Doakes about 1769. Jane was born about 1751. The Botetourt County records show John Alcorn and his wife, Jane, bought 120 acres of land on Looney's Creek on May the Second 1770 for £50. The records of May 5, 1773, show that the Court of Fincastle County, Virginia, assigned John Alcorn and others to assess the feasibility of building a proposed road in Fincastle County.

John took the oath of Ensign in the Virginia militia on May 5, 1778. He was assigned to Captain John Montgomery's company. This took place in the Court of Montgomery County, Virginia. On December 1, 1778 John Alcorn bought 201 acres of land in Montgomery County. John's name appeared on the docket of the grand jurors of Montgomery County on November 2, 1779. On May 3, 1780, John Alcorn, John Bethel, and others were awarded 40 acres each in the Montgomery County Court for army service under Colonel George Washington. The claimants were represented before the court by Patrick Henry.

On September 2, 1782, John Alcorn Sr., sold 39 acres of land on Reed's Creek, Montgomery County, Virginia, to John Alcorn, the son of James

Alcorn. On the same day John, the son of James, bought 44 acres on Reed's Creek from John Mills, his grandfather.

According to the annals of South West Virginia, John Alcorn was certified as a lieutenant of the Virginia militia on November 28 1786. John moved his family to Madison County Kentucky about 1788. He was listed as a taxpayer of Madison County in 1789. In 1793 John gave Robert Breckenridge, his brother-in-law, power of attorney to dispose of property for him in Wythe County, Virginia. I believe this transaction was made to settle the estate of George Breckenridge.

The children of John and Jane were, I believe, John Jr.; George; Robert; and two or three daughters whom I have been unable to identify. The

records list many Alcorn girls as having married from 1789 to 1799 in Mercer, Madison, Garrard, and Lincoln Counties, and it is hard to say

whose children they were. John Jr. was born about 1770. He was shown as a taxpayer in Madison County in 1800. I think he moved to Mason County by 1810, and then to Jefferson County Indiana by 1820.

The Kentucky census of 1800 shows a Robert Alcorn as head of a family in Mercer County, a Robert Alcorn as head of a family in Garrard County, and a Robert Alcorn as head of a family in Jessamine County. I believe that the Robert in Garrard County was the son of John Alcorn Sr., that the Robert Alcorn in Mercer County was the son of Robert Alcorn Sr., who died in 1797, and that the Robert in Jessamine County could have been he son of William, George, or James.


The Kentucky census of 1800 also shows a George Alcorn in Madison County, and the 1810 census of Madison County shows a George Alcorn, a wife, and eight children. This George, I believe, was the son of John Alcorn Sr., and was probably named for his grandfather, George Breckenridge. The 1800 census of Kentucky also shows a George Alcorn in Jessamine County as head of a family, and a George Alcorn in Pulaski County. One of these, I believe to be the George Alcorn who was born in Pee Dee, North Carolina in 1760; the other perhaps was his son.

The same census shows a James Alcorn as head of a family in Anderson County and a James Alcorn in Mercer County as head of a family. The James Alcorn in Mercer County was probably the son of Robert Alcorn Sr. The 1800 census shows a Thomas Alcorn in Madison County, and a William Alcorn as heads of families. William and Thomas, I believe were the sons of Robert Alcorn Sr.

John Alcorn Sr. was active in the formation of Garrard County in 1796, and was appointed a Justice of the County at the time.



William Turpin was the proven father of Susannah Turpin Welch Alcorn. Problem is no one seems to know which William Turpin is her real father.

We know that William was alive as late as 23 May 1796 as he gave the clerk permission to issue a license for marriage of his daughter Susanna Welch to marry Robert Alcorn.

William Turpin who left a will in 1816, Garrard County, Kentucky is not the father of our Susannah. Although this William Turpin did have a daughter named Susanna in his will this is not our Susannah for one main reason. The Susanna in his will is still single and proof of that is that he had 2 married daughters in 1816. If this Susannah was married she would have been referred to by her married name.

Still others have insisted that William Turpin who left a will dated 22 November 1824 is our William. This William states in his will he has 5 heirs, even naming his deceased daughter, but he has no daughter named Susannah. He even goes as far to name a deceased brother in his Will. There is no mention of a daughter named Susan/ Susannah etc or the married name Alcorn in this Will.







> Littleton Tingle is no doubt a descendant of Hugh and Elizabeth Powell Tingle, but exactly how is not sure. Through a process of elimination Virginia Tolman, a long time Tingle researcher, has determined that is is likely that Littleton is a grandson of Samuel and Sarah (possibly Farwell) Tingle (son of Samuel and Sarah Cobb Tingle) and a son of Oliver. She feels fairly certain that Littleton and Jasper were brothers and that Littleton was a cousin of Thomas and John.

100. Thomas John Bishop was born about 1731 in Anne Arundel Co., Maryland. He was the son of Thomas Bishop (200) and Elizabeth Barber (201).

Thomas John died in Berkeley Co., West Virginia.

Thomas John Bishop worked with his father, Thomas Bishop, who owned a lot of land. In the deed books Thomas John signs with his father on the tobacco crops and other mortgages, as normally the oldest son inherits everything according to tradition and English law.

According to newspapers at the time, they were living on Elk Ridge in Anne Arundel Co., MD. Thomas died without a will before 1788 probably between 1782 and 1787. In June of 1788, Thomas John's mother deeds everything to the children of her deceased son Solomon Bishop. Solomon's wife was pregnant with Nimrod at this time and he was not mentioned in Elizabeth's deed of gift as an unborn child, so Elizabeth either ignored it or she didn't know as Nimrod is not mentioned. Thomas John Bishop packed up his family and moved to the Berkeley/Frederick County area of Virginia where he purchased land and started over sometime between 1782 and 1787.

Solomon and his wife, Catherine, moved to Nelson Co., KY, where they owned land, raised a large family of 12 children. He serviced in the Revolutionary War and applied for a pension.

+ 50 m IV. **Elisha Bishop** was born in Anne Arundel Co. in 1760. He died in Henry Co., Kentucky, in 1809 at the age of 49.

Elisha Bishop served in the Revolutionary War. He lived in Frederick County, VA when he entered the service in Berkeley Co., VA, as a substitute for his father Thomas Bishop' in March 1777; under Captain Thomas Catlett for a tour of six months. He served with his brother Solomon Bishop. When they were discharged Solomon returned home but Elisha reenlisted and remained in New Jersey with his Company. He served under Captain Catlett for 2 years according to the records and was discharged Sept 1779. He was in the battle of Stoney Point, NY and the expedition of Paulus Hook, N.J.

In 1780 he moved to that area of Virginia which later became Woodford Co., Kentucky.9 In March 1781 he enlisted for a tour of 6 months under Captain Berry as a private against the Indians. In September 1782 he again enlisted for a tour of 6 months under Captain Callaway as a scout and a spy against the Indians.

Those persons who signed with him were his neighbors Charles Hughley and William McCracken. William McCracken was his brotherin-law having married Elizabeth's younger sister, Lindsey Ellis 28 Jul 1800 in Woodford Co. At the time of his application, there was no clergyman in the neighborhood where he was living although he was a member of the Baptist Church. Other persons who gave affidavits were Thomas Smith, whose brother George had served with Elisha. Mary Smith wife of Thomas, states that Elisha visited her father's home in Frederick Co., VA, while on furlough. Stephen Bowen, Francis E. Skidmore and Elisabeth Skidmore all state in 1833 that Elisha Bishop was a member of the Baptist Church for the last 20 years. He received a land Warrant for his services in the Revolutionary War.

He married 13 Apr 1786 to Elizabeth Ellis daughter of William Ellis and Caroline Hancock in Frederick Co., VA.

In 1799/1800 he moved from Woodford Co. to Clark Co., KY, where his brothers Benjamin and Thomas Bishop were living. Benjamin married Elizabeth Ballard in Clark County. His brother Michael was living in Henry County as well as the Ellises who had moved from Woodford County to Henry County. Michael fnally persuaded his brothers to move from Clark County to Henry County, which they all did in 1806. Elisha Bishop could not read or write but he was still a shrewd business man investing in land in Henry County with relatives and friends and he was a neighbor of Littleton Tingle. Due to the lack of schools available in early Henry County, he along with Littleton Tingle hired a tutor to teach their combined families in which all of their children learned to read and write. He had the help of his sons-in-law Edward Tingle, John Tingle, Henry Suddeth, nephews Jonathan Ellis,

William Ellis and others when it came to matters of business. as co-signers on mortgages, etc. Due to a funny Kentucky law, deeds on land do not have to be recorded unless the land goes out of the family; then the deed -must be recorded. Sometimes families will go ahead and record the deeds but not always. For example Elisha Bishop either sold or gave to his son Elisha Bishop Jr a tract of land, there is no deed but in 1828, Elisha Bishop Jr. took out a mortgage and the mortgage states "a certain tract of land conveyed to him by Elisha Bishop Senr." Number of acres not given. I know that Elisha Bishop purchased along with others 9000 acres and Elisha's share would be over 1000 acres plus his warrant. I've only found one deed on that land when Elisha Bishop sold 175 acres to his son-in-law John Tingle. When I was in Kentucky in 1970, I visited with a distant-relative and he was living on 100 acres that he received from his mother who had received it from her father who gave each of his 10 children 100 acres each. No deeds on the land but I know that both of his great-grandfathers were Littleton Tingle and Elisha Bishop and both of them had purchased large tracts of land-but not together.

Elisha Bishop died in either late 1843 or early 1844.



The disposition of Elizabeth Bishop taken at the house of Elisha Bishop in Henry County, Kentucky on the 5th day of Oct 1833, who being first duly sworn according to law states that she was well acquainted with Leonard Ellis decd of Henry County Ky in his lifetime. That the said Leonard Ellis departed this life sometime in August last and that prior to his death he was making as she understood an application to be placed on the pension roll of the United States as a soldier of the Revolution.

She further states that the said Leonard Ellis at the time of his death left a widow by name Jane Ellis who still survives. She also states that she is the daughter of William Ellis who was a Brother of the said Leonard Ellis and that she is now about 64 years of age and was a girl of tolerable size for a child during the revolutionary war that about that period and during said War she frequently saw her Uncle Leonard Ellis. She recollects distinctly of seeing the said Leonard Ellis at one time during the War of the Revolution start from home prepared to enter the army and with the reprep? Design of doing so. She cannot say who his officers were nor for what length of time he entered the army but she knows that he was gone for some time. She further states that she has understood from him and others of the family and relations during the time of the said War that he served in other tours besides that afore which she saw him start as above named. She is confident from what she saw, and heard about the matter that the said Leonard Ellis did serve several tours of duty during the revolutionary War.

Swore to and subscribed the day and year aforesaid. Elizabeth (x her mark) Bishop

Also the disposition of Elisha Bishop taken at the same time and place and for the same purpose who being first duly sworn upon his oath states that he was well acquainted with Leonard Ellis spoken of in the above disposition of his wife Elizabeth Bishop that he this deponent married into the family 47 years ago and he was from that period up to this time understood from the said Leonard Ellis and his brother William Ellis, who was the father of this deponents wife, that the said Leonard Ellis did serve in the army of the revolution. He has also heard the same thing from others and he has no doubt upon his word from what he has understood and from conversations which he this deponent had had with the said Leonard that he did serve in the army of the revolution. And he is confident that he must have been in the service at the taking of Cornwallis.



According to newspapers at the time, they were living on Elk Ridge in Anne Arundel Co., MD. Thomas died without a will before 1788 probably between 1782 and 1787. In June of 1788, Thomas John's mother deeds everything to the children of her deceased son Solomon Bishop. Solomon's wife was pregnant with Nimrod at this time and he was not mentioned in Elizabeth's deed of gift as an unborn child, so Elizabeth either ignored it or she didn't know as Nimrod is not mentioned. Thomas John Bishop packed up his family and moved to the Berkeley/Frederick County area of Virginia where he purchased land and started over sometime between 1782 and 1787.

The Old Court record book of Somerset County shows this interesting item - "Samuel Tingle Son of Hugh Tingle borne of Elizabeth his wife ye

17th day of September one thousand six hundred eighty & four." It is rare to find a marriage and birth record in an official colonial court volume.

385. Samuel married **Sarah Cobb** on November 18, 1716, in Somerset Co. They had two sons.

Sarah was born in of Somerset Co., MD, about 1690. She was the daughter of Samuel Cobb (770) and Mary _____ (771).

This may be the Mary 'named as a widow' referenced in the Somerset County Court Tax records or Wicomico Hundred with one slave Harry in 1739.

Sarah received her one-third interest and the balance was distributed to the five children. All of this was taking place at the time when Delaware and Maryland boundary dispute was being settled. The boundary became known as the Mason and Dixon line. Some the Tingle lands which had been in Worcester County, Maryland ended up in Sussex County, Deleware. [This was taken from notes of Jo Ann Rice who is a Tingle researcher.]

The grandchildren listed for Samuel and Sarah are correctly listed with the exception of Jasper who probably is a grandson but they may be incorrectly attached. According to Virginia Tolman, Jasper was not a son of Thomas Tingle. [Source: E-mails from Virginia Tolman]

Oliver and Matthias Tingle both along with their father Samuel appear on the tax records of Sussex County Delaware. Samuel appears on the tax records of both Maryland and Delaware. 768. Hugh Tingle was born in 1654 in Belton-en-Axholme, Lincoln, England. He was the son of Symon Tingle (1536) and Isabel Kitchin (1537).

Hugh was christened in Axholme on April 13, 1654. He immigrated on April 26, 1669. England to Maryland.

Hugh signed his will on April 28, 1723, in Somerset Co., Maryland. He died at now Worcester in Somerset Co. before August 22, 1733. His estate was probated on August 22, 1733, in Somerset Co.

The first settler bearing the surname Tingle, in what is now Worcester County, Maryland, would appear to be Hugh Tingle. He was probably from England since the surname appears in parish records of Yorkshire, Lincoln, Derby, Nottingham, Gloucester and Sussex Counties.

Hugh Tingle (his surname was spelled Tingles) was one of seven persons 'imported' into Maryland on 26 April 1669 by Christopher Rousby who received 350 acres of land thereby. Hugh was fourteen years of age. Mr. Rousby was a Royal Customs officer who was later murdured by George Talbot, the hot-headed nephew of Lord Baltimore. The ship was under the command of Thomas Pieghen, Master. It is not clear whether the name of the vessel was 'Whittby' or whether it sailed from Whitby, England. This port is situated on the North Sea coast, not too far from the Yorkshires.

"Hugh "Tengle and Elizabeth Powell were married by Mr. Trail, Minister, ye twenty-first day of December, Anno Domini, one thousand six hundred eighty-three." Willaim Traile was one of the earliest Presbyterian Ministers, arriving in the colonies shortly after Rev. Frances Makemie, founder of the Presbyterian Church in America.

Elizabeth Powell was the daughter of Walter Powell and Margaret Berry. Her father was a Quaker and "one of the highest class of early settlers in Somerset County." It should be mentioned that this part of the county did not become Worcester until the latter was erected from it in 1742.

Hugh and Eliazabeth started a family immediately. The old court record book of Somerset County shows this interesting item - "Samuell Tingle Son of Hugh Borne of Elizabeth his wife ye 17th day of September one thousand six hundred eighty & four."

The couple appear to have lived at first on part of a tract called "Powell's Inclusion." The record of its survey reads: "Powell's Inclusion, 256 acres, surveyed May 2, 1686 for Walter Powell, back from the seaboard side. 128 acres possessed by Hugh Tingle in his wife's right, the residue by Walter Evans." Walter Evans was Hugh's brother-in-law, having married Mary Powell, sister of Elizabeth Powell Tingle. Their father, Walter Powell, gave Elizabeth and Mary this tract and other land in his will.

On 28 November 1689, Hugh sighed the "Address of Loyalty to King

William and Queen Mary.

On July 18, 1693, Hugh purchased 200 acres called "Dumfreise" from Thomas and Mary Fenwick for 4,000 pounds of tobacco. This farm was in the northeast part of what is now Worchester county near Fenwick Island. Hugh adopted the name Dumfeise for his plantation. Hush also acquired 75 acres known as Hilliard's Discovery, 100 acres known as Parker's Denial and 200 acres known as Scottish Plot, for a total of 903 acres.

Hugh Tingle made his will on 28 April 1723, and was probated 22 August 1733. His wife, Elizabeth, survived him about thirteen years. Her will, dated 18 May 1740, was proven 19 July 1746. Hugh left Layfield's Lott to his eldest son Hugh. He also mentions three daughters: Margaret Hudson, Sarah Collings and Elisabeth. He leaves Parke's Denial to five children:Hugh, John, Margaret, Sarah, Elisabeth. He also mentions his wife, and the following children: Littleton and Samuel (both under 21), Mary Cob Daniel. His son John, who was also his executor, got the plantation called Dumfries. He also mentions his grandson Littleton Tingle. The will was witnessed by Richard Logwood, William Kennet, and Benjamin Burton. It was appraised by Joseph Wyatt and John Holland.

It would appear that Hugh Tingle was a well-respected and substantial citizen as shown by his will and by certain affidavits submitted by his neighbors after his death, relative to the lengthy boundary dispute between William Penn's heirs and the various Lords Baltimore, concerning the Delaware-Maryland line. One disposition refers to "Hugh Tingle as an 'antient' man of good credit who lived within a mile or two of Fenwick Island."

Most, if not all, of Hugh's land were originally in Somerset County, Maryland. This part of Somerset County became part of Worcester County, Maryland in 1742. Upon the settlement of a boundary dispute settled by the Chancery Court of England and signed by King George III in 1769, nearly all of Hugh's land became situated in Sussex County, Delaware.The first settler bearing the surname Tingle, in what is now Worcester County, Maryland, would appear to be Hugh Tingle. He was probably from England since the surname appears in parish records of Yorkshire, Lincoln, Derby, Nottingham, Gloucester and Sussex Counties.

More facts and events for Hugh Tingle:

Residence: June 01, 1681 Maryland - Registered Cattle Mark

769. At the age of 29, Hugh married **Elizabeth Powell** on December 22, 1683, at now Worcester Co., Maryland in Stepney Parish, Somerset Co., when she was 13 years old. They had eleven children.

Elizabeth was born in Accomack Co., Virginia, on January 19, 1670. She signed her will on May 18, 1740.

Elizabeth reached 75 years of age and died at now Worcester in Somerset Co., Maryland, in 1746. She was buried in Worcester Co. Her estate was probated on July 19, 1746. Hugh's wedding to Elizabeth Powell was performed by Rev. William Trail of the North of Ireland and is said to have been the first wedding in the county in which a Presbyterian minister officiated. Rev. Trail is said to have been an associate of Rev. Francis Makemie, the first Presbyterian minister in the county. Some references suggest that the marriage was actually in 1693. She was the daughter of Walter Powell (1538) and Margaret Berry (1539).

Walter Powell lived at "Greenfield," bequeathing this plantation, at his death in 1696/7, to his son, William Powell. William Powell likewise made his home at "Greenfield" and, dying in 1715, devised the plantation to his son, John Powell. Walter Powell directed by his will, dated March 27, 1695, probated February 4, 1696/7, that his body "be buried in the Quaker burying ground." William Powell's will, dated April 15, 1715, probated June 22, 1715, requests "to be buried according to the direction of the Quakers."

(footnote) Somerset Court, Liber DT, No. 7, pp. 41-3, deed, July, 1670, from Thomas Walker to Walter Powell for the three tracts of land, "Greenfield," "Middle," and "Exchange"; see wills of Walter and William Powell in Maryland Calendar of Wills, Vol. II, p. 102, and Vol. IV, p. 76. Walter Powell was evidently not a Quaker when he came into Somerset County to reside in 1669 or 1670. We find that John Powell, son of Walter and Margaret Powell, was born at Pocomoke [Pocomoke Hundred], September 27, 1674, "and baptized ye 25 day of October next following" (Somerset Court, Liber IKL, p. 209), and that Elizabeth Powell (who was daughter of Walter Powell) was married December 22, 1683, to Hugh Tingle, "by William Traile, minister" (Ibid.). William Traile was a Presbyterian minister. Now we know that Quakers did not submit their children to "baptism," nor were they married by ordained ministers. Evidently Walter Powell and his household became "convinced" later than 1674, when his infant son, John, was baptized. The date of his "conviction" and becoming a "Friend" is not known. That his daughter, Elizabeth, was married to Hugh Tingle by a Presbyterian minister is not evidence that Walter Powell may not have become a "Friend" before that

date. Parents who are "Friends" cannot be held accountable for the acts of their children any more than parents who are "non-Friends." Ladies in marrying--even gentle Quaker ladies--sometimes make choice "out of meeting"!

Will dated November 20, 1695 and proved February 4, 1695/96. "To my son, William Powell, the plantation I now live on called 'Granfield' and 50 acres called 'Powell's Addition' with 100 acres of land joining the marsh of the tract of land called 'Winter Quarter' called 'Powell's Addition'.

"To my son, John Powell, my land called 'Winter Quarter' on the seaside. "To my daughters, Elizabeth Tingle and Mary Evans, one tract of land called 'Hilliars Discovery' and one tract called 'Powell's Mill Pond,' 250 acres, the said two tracts containing 390 acres to be equally divided between them.

"To my daughter, Margaret Schoolfield, land called 'Olivins Portion' lying at the seaside, containing 150 acres.

"To my daughter, Catherine Powell, land called 'Friends Gift', 150 acres, lying at the seaboard side in Somerset County.

"To all my grandchildren, one cow each. All the rest of my movable estate to be divided among my six children, viz: William, John, Elizabeth, Mary, Margaret and Catherine, and my daughter Sarah, to be equally divided.

"My three sons, viz: William Powell, John Powell and Henry Schoolfield, my sole execs."

Hugh's wife, Elizabeth, survived him by about thirteen years. Her will, dated the 18th of May 1740, was proven on the 19th of July 1746. Eight children were born to Hugh and Elizabeth Tingle as far as is known, all of whom are named in his will. Elizabeth's will: To son Daniel, the tract of land called "Hiliard's Discovery", 75 acres, and another tract called "Powell's Inclusion", 128 acres; all her hogs, and a bed that is at his house; and he to be the executor. To Caleb Tingle, one great pot and hangers. To Mary Tingle, wife of Daniel, One chist (Chest) and Hackell. To son Daniel, one cow and calf, one heffer, and one house colt. Do make and ordain and consitute this is my Last Will and Testament in the manner and form following: Viz, Principally and first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it, my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian manner, at the direction of my Executers herein after named and as touching such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life. I give, divide and dispose of in the manner and form following.

Item, I give and bequesth to my sons James and Jacob all my rites-title to a property, a tract of land that I purchased of Elisha Cox, patented by a Nathaniel Draper, on the West side of Bay River, with all the appertments or otherwise that which I receive of Cap. Nathaniel Draper in the exchange thereof with it appertances by them to be fully freely protected and enjoyed and their heirs for ever. Item, I give and bequeth to my Daughter Rachel, a negro boy named Milbee by her to be protected and enjoyed and the heirs of her body for ever, but and if the said Rachel should die leaving no heirs, then the said negro shall be sold at public sale and the proceeds to be equally divided among my other children.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Gideon the Plantation and tract of land whereon I now live with 50 acres of land of a new patent adjoining at the North end there of, with all their privledges and apperterances. (a part of the will covered by tape) .. And also a negro, wench named Lilly and a lad names Titus, a negro called Henry, and also a still and a trumpet made gun and all my working tools of all sorts by him to be fully and forceibly possed and enjoyed for ever and his heirs in like manner. Also a pair of Handmill stones.

Item, The remaining part of all my personal estate, goods and chattles, I leave to be equally divided among all my sons and daughter, Hugh excepted and that it be divided chiefly by the Executors. Lastly I do make and ordain my two sons Joseph and Gideon jointly coequal Executators of this my Last Will and Testament, hereby utterly revoking all and every will or wills or legacies whatsoever by me heretofore made. In the year of our Lord the 10th day of Sep. 1764, signed Hugh Tingle

The estate of Christopher Jr, who died 15 years before Sr. was divided among Jr's children ..."Due Xopher,Samuel Benjamine,and Sarah Branch for their parts of a maidservant belonging to their father's estate, for which we have deducted the summe being 800 pounds ... also Xopher Branch is to pay the other three for his father's halfe of the negroes 500 lb tobac each,it being the former rate set when Thos. Jefferson received his wife's due.."

Christopher was born about 1627, a son of another Christopher Branch and Mary Addy. Although hegrew up in Henrico County where he continued to own some land, he lived in Charles City County where heI was a justice of the peace. Since few Charles City records remain, little is known of his life there.

He lived through some extraordinary times in English history. In 1649, when he was about 20, Parliament condemned King Charles to death. For 4 years Virginia was a colony of the Commonwealth of England until Oliver Cromwell anointed himself lord protector. Dissatisfied with how government affairs were being handled, England overthrew the Puritans and returned to a monarchy, restoring Charles II to the throne of his father in 1660.

His wife, Sarah Almond, was the mother of Christopher, Samuel, Benjamin, Mary, and Sarah Branch whom his father helped rear after he died in my 30s. One of his grandsons was Thomas Jefferson, grandfather of the president of that name. He had a few congressmen and governors among his descendants, too, not to mention more than 35 state legislators.



Symon moved back to Whitton, which is in the northern-most part of Lincolnshire. He met Isabel Kitchen in the near-by market town of Winterton. They had a child out of wedlock, Hugh, which was baptized on June 10, 1846.

The first settler bearing the surname Tingle, in what is now Worcester County, Maryland, would appear to be Hugh Tingle. He was probably from England since the surname appears in parish records of Yorkshire, Lincoln, Derby, Nottingham, Gloucester and Sussex Counties.

Hugh Tingle (his surname was spelled Tingles) was one of seven persons 'imported' into Maryland on 26 April 1669 by Christopher Rousby who received 350 acres of land thereby. Hugh was fourteen years of age. Mr. Rousby was a Royal Customs officer who was later murdured by George Talbot, the hot-headed nephew of Lord Baltimore. The ship was under the command of Thomas Pieghen, Master. It is not clear whether the name of the vessel was 'Whittby' or whether it sailed from Whitby, England. This port is situated on the North Sea coast, not too far from the Yorkshires.

"Hugh "Tengle and Elizabeth Powell were married by Mr. Trail, Minister, ye twenty-first day of December, Anno Domini, one thousand six hundred eighty-three." Willaim Traile was one of the earliest Presbyterian Ministers, arriving in the colonies shortly after Rev. Frances Makemie, founder of the Presbyterian Church in America.

Elizabeth Powell was the daughter of Walter Powell and Margaret Berry. Her father was a Quaker and "one of the highest class of early settlers in Somerset County." It should be mentioned that this part of the county did not become Worcester until the latter was erected from it in 1742.

Hugh and Eliazabeth started a family immediately. The old court record book of Somerset County shows this interesting item - "Samuell Tingle Son of Hugh Borne of Elizabeth his wife ye 17th day of September one thousand six hundred eighty & four."

The couple appear to have lived at first on part of a tract called "Powell's Inclusion." The record of its survey reads: "Powell's Inclusion, 256 acres, surveyed May 2, 1686 for Walter Powell, back from the seaboard side. 128 acres possessed by Hugh Tingle in his wife's right, the residue by Walter Evans." Walter Evans was Hugh's brother-in-law, having married Mary Powell, sister of Elizabeth Powell Tingle. Their father, Walter Powell, gave Elizabeth and Mary this tract and other land in his will.

On 28 November 1689, Hugh sighed the "Address of Loyalty to King William and Queen Mary.

On July 18, 1693, Hugh purchased 200 acres called "Dumfreise" from Thomas and Mary Fenwick for 4,000 pounds of tobacco. This farm was in the northeast part of what is now Worchester county near Fenwick Island. Hugh adopted the name Dumfeise for his plantation. Hush also acquired 75 acres known as Hilliard's Discovery, 100 acres known as Parker's Denial and 200 acres known as Scottish Plot, for a total of 903 acres.


Hugh Tingle made his will on 28 April 1723, and was probated 22 August 1733. His wife, Elizabeth, survived him about thirteen years. Her will, dated 18 May 1740, was proven 19 July 1746. Hugh left Layfield's Lott to his eldest son Hugh. He also mentions three daughters: Margaret Hudson, Sarah Collings and Elisabeth. He leaves Parke's Denial to five children:Hugh, John, Margaret, Sarah, Elisabeth. He also mentions his wife, and the following children: Littleton and Samuel (both under 21), Mary Cob Daniel. His son John, who was also his executor, got the plantation called Dumfries. He also mentions his grandson Littleton Tingle. The will was witnessed by Richard Logwood, William Kennet, and Benjamin Burton. It was appraised by Joseph Wyatt and John Holland.

It would appear that Hugh Tingle was a well-respected and substantial citizen as shown by his will and by certain affidavits submitted by his neighbors after his death, relative to the lengthy boundary dispute between William Penn's heirs and the various Lords Baltimore, concerning the Delaware-Maryland line. One disposition refers to "Hugh Tingle as an 'antient' man of good credit who lived within a mile or two of Fenwick Island."

Most, if not all, of Hugh's land were originally in Somerset County, Maryland. This part of Somerset County became part of Worcester County, Maryland in 1742. Upon the settlement of a boundary dispute settled by the Chancery Court of England and signed by King George III in 1769, nearly all of Hugh's land became situated in Sussex County, Delaware.The first settler bearing the surname Tingle, in what is now Worcester County, Maryland, would appear to be Hugh Tingle. He was probably from England since the surname appears in parish records of Yorkshire, Lincoln, Derby, Nottingham, Gloucester and Sussex Counties.

Walter Powell lived at "Greenfield," bequeathing this plantation, at his death in 1696/7, to his son, William Powell. William Powell likewise made his home at "Greenfield" and, dying in 1715, devised the plantation to his son, John Powell. Walter Powell directed by his will, dated March 27, 1695, probated February 4, 1696/7, that his body "be buried in the Quaker burying ground." William Powell's will, dated April 15, 1715, probated June 22, 1715, requests "to be buried according to the direction of the Quakers."

(footnote) Somerset Court, Liber DT, No. 7, pp. 41-3, deed, July, 1670, from Thomas Walker to Walter Powell for the three tracts of land, "Greenfield," "Middle," and "Exchange"; see wills of Walter and William Powell in Maryland Calendar of Wills, Vol. II, p. 102, and Vol. IV, p. 76. Walter Powell was evidently not a Quaker when he came into Somerset County to reside in 1669 or 1670. We find that John Powell, son of Walter and Margaret Powell, was born at Pocomoke [Pocomoke Hundred], September 27, 1674, "and baptized ye 25 day of October next following" (Somerset Court, Liber IKL, p. 209), and that Elizabeth Powell (who was daughter of Walter Powell) was married December 22, 1683, to Hugh Tingle, "by William Traile, minister" (Ibid.). William Traile was a Presbyterian minister. Now we know that Quakers did not submit their children to "baptism," nor were they married by ordained ministers. Evidently Walter Powell and his household became "convinced" later than 1674, when his infant son, John, was baptized. The date of his "conviction" and becoming a "Friend" is not known. That his daughter, Elizabeth, was married to Hugh Tingle by a Presbyterian minister is not evidence that Walter Powell may not have become a "Friend" before that date. Parents who are "Friends" cannot be held accountable for the acts of their children any more than parents who are "non-Friends." Ladies in marrying--even gentle Quaker ladies-sometimes make choice "out of meeting"!

Will dated November 20, 1695 and proved February 4,

"To my son, William Powell, the plantation I now live on called 'Granfield' and 50 acres called 'Powell's Addition' with 100 acres of land joining the marsh of the tract of land called 'Winter Quarter'

"To my son, John Powell, my land called 'Winter Quarter' on the seaside.

"To my daughters, Elizabeth Tingle and Mary Evans, one tract of land called 'Hilliars Discovery' and one tract called 'Powell's Mill Pond,'

250 acres, the said two tracts containing 390 acres to be equally divided between them.

"To my daughter, Margaret Schoolfield, land called 'Olivins Portion' lying at the seaside, containing 150 acres.

"To all my grandchildren, one cow each. All the rest of my movable estate to be divided among my six children, viz: William, John, Elizabeth, Mary, Margaret and Catherine, and my daughter Sarah, to be

equally divided.

"My three sons, viz: William Powell, John Powell and Henry Schoolfield, my sole execs."

Hugh's wife, Elizabeth, survived him by about thirteen years. Her will, dated the 18th of May 1740, was proven on the 19th of July 1746. Eight children were born to Hugh and Elizabeth Tingle as far as is known, all of whom are named in his will. Elizabeth's will: To son Daniel, the tract of land called "Hiliard's Discovery", 75 acres, and another tract called "Powell's Inclusion", 128 acres; all her hogs, and a bed that is at his house; and he to be the executor. To Caleb Tingle, one great pot and hangers. To Mary Tingle, wife of Daniel, One chist (Chest) and Hackell. To son Daniel, one cow and calf, one heffer, and one house colt. To dau., Mary, one pewter dish and tankard, one wulling wheel, one chist and one bed. To Mary Cobb, jun., one new wheel, and all the tesator's movables. Witnesses: Benjamin Davis, Richard Beddard.
