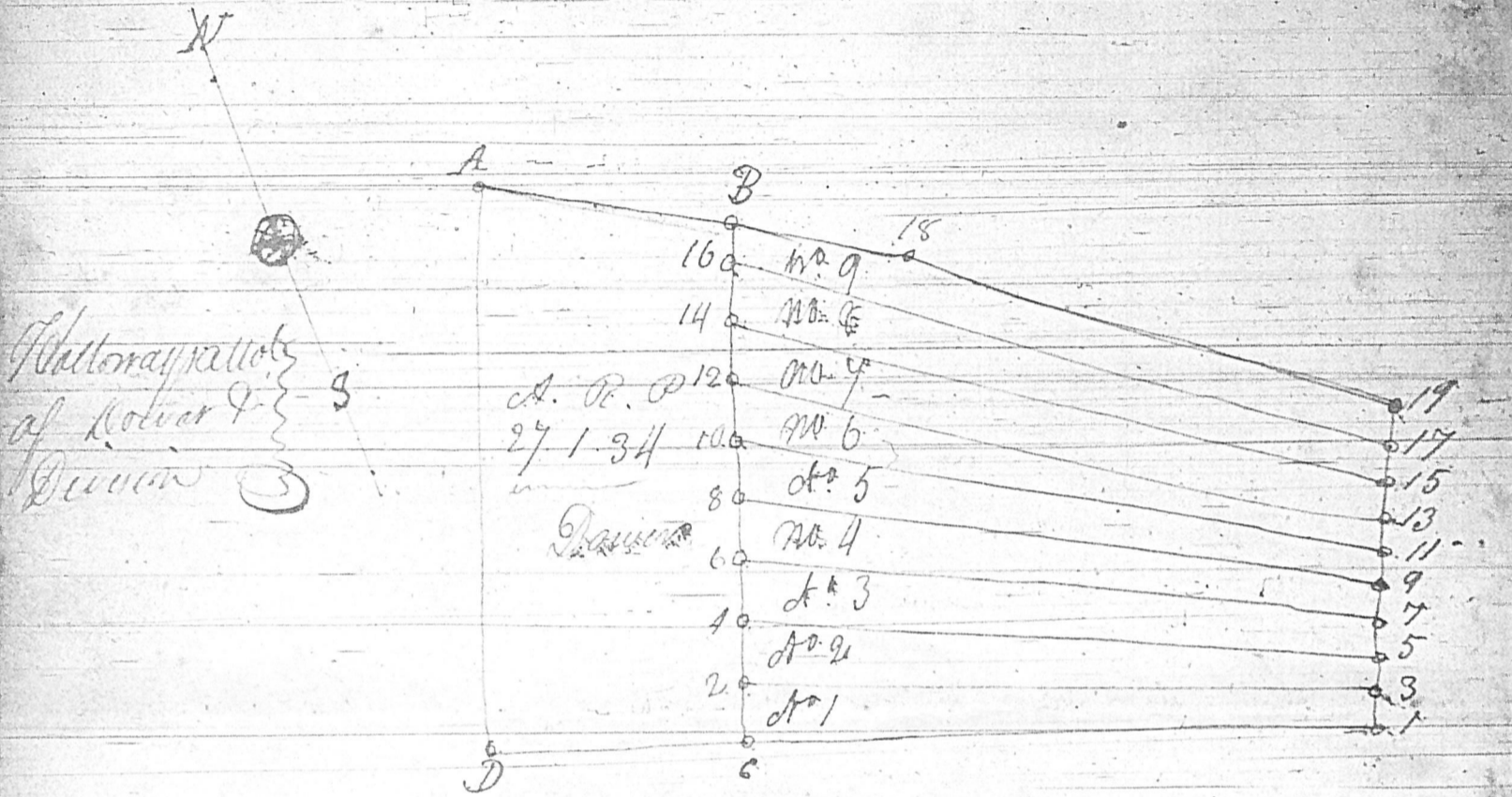

The presence of an exec named by the worshipful County Court of the County of Clarke appointing us James Stewart, Margus Dickerson and Thomas Hart commissioners to settle unto Elizabeth Hallows widow and sole of John Hallows deceased his down in the Estate of his deceased husband both real & personal and to settle the residue of said real Estate after the allotment of same among the heirs of said deceased, with the said commissioners met at the late mansion house of said John Hallows Dec 16<sup>th</sup> day of January 1824 being attended by the heirs of said deceased that all of legal age, in their proper persons and by the Guardians of the infant heirs of said Estate we then proceeded to view the premises being first both settled and assign unto the said Elizabeth Hallows widow as of record 27 acres, one rood and 34 square poles as her down in a tract of land
